



DAYS OUT WITH MOORSBUS FROM KIRKBYSMOORSIDE

Every Saturday, Sunday & Bank Holiday in July, August & September 2021

Moorsbus is a network of friendly, wheelchair accessible, public bus services to and through the North York Moors. Contactless payment available. English National Concessionary Passes are accepted. Single fares are available from just £1. All day Moors Rover tickets are £9.50 and up to 2 children travel free with each fare-paying adult. There's a Young Person's Moors Rover (£2.50) for the 5 to 18s, and a Family Moors Rover at £15. Well-behaved dogs are welcome. The EY 128 bus and the Reliance 31X bus (Helmsley – York), and Arriva 5, 63, 81, X3, X4, X93 also sell / accept Moors Rover tickets.

In towns, Moorsbuses use existing bus stops. In country areas, give a clear signal to the driver to get on, and tell the driver in advance where you'd like to get off.

Departure times shown are from the bus-stop by Moorside Antiques.

Moorsbuses do a clockwise circuit around Kirkbymoorside bus-stops.

National Park Moors Centre, Danby

At the Moors Centre you'll find a café, art gallery with different exhibitions, bird hide, shop, pretty walks of different lengths, indoor and outdoor children's play areas. Free admission.

Saturday: (travel via *Bilsdale, Stokesley, Guisborough*) depart Kirkbymoorside 11.15 arrive Moors Centre 13.51, return from Moors Centre at 14.34, arrive Kirkbymoorside 17.10.

Sunday: (travel via *Hutton le Hole, Blakey Lion Inn*) depart 11.45, 12.15, 14.30 and 17.30. Return home (Danby to Kirkbymoorside) at 13.14, 15.00 or 16.14.

Sutton Bank Visitor Centre

Saturday: leave Kirkbymoorside at 11.15, arriving at Sutton Bank 11.45 for walks along the Cleveland Way (back to Helmsley or Rievaulx, or to the White Horse of Kilburn). Return from Sutton Bank at 16.40, arriving Kirkbymoorside at 17.10.

Sunday: Catch the 128 to Helmsley at 09.02 11.02 13.02 14.02. Moorsbus M4 to Sutton Bank leaves Helmsley at 10.30, 11.30, 14.45 & 15.45. Return from Sutton Bank to Helmsley on M4 at 11.05, 11.45, 15.05 & 17.05. The 128 departs Helmsley 11.30 13.30 14.30 16.30 18.30 for Kirkbymoorside.

The Lion Inn, Blakey Ridge, for coffee, beer, lunch or walks such as following the old railway line down to Rosedale Abbey to catch the M6 back to Pickering.

Saturday: Depart 11.15 arrive Lion Inn 11.37; depart Lion Inn 12.55 or 16.45.

Sunday: Depart 11.45 or 12.15. Return 13.33, 15.19 or 16.33.

Hutton-le-Hole

Visit Ryedale Folk Museum and free gallery, the church, cafes, craft shops and walks.

Saturday: Depart 11.15, arrive Hutton le Hole 11.25. Return from Hutton le Hole at 13.07 or 16.57

Sunday: Depart 11.45, 12.15 or 14.30. Return from Hutton le Hole at 13.45, 15.31 or 16.45.

Rievaulx Abbey (and part of the Cleveland Way)

Rievaulx Terrace & Temples (National Trust) and Rievaulx Abbey (English Heritage), plus the Cleveland Way and Rievaulx village and church make this an enchanting location.

Saturday: Depart Kirkbymoorside on M4 at 11.15, arrive Rievaulx 12.15. Return M4 bus from Rievaulx at 16.10 to Kirkbymoorside (arrive 17.10), or walk along the Cleveland Way to Helmsley (about an hour's walk) and catch five-past-the-hour EY128 to Kirkbymoorside, or Moorsbus M4 at 16.55.

Sunday: Depart Kirkbymoorside on 128 at 11.02. At Helmsley catch M4 at 11.30 to Rievaulx Abbey. Return from Rievaulx to Helmsley at 13.35, 14.35, 15.35 or 16.35.

Rosedale Abbey

Tea rooms, pub, Rosedale glass works, lovely walks...

Saturday: Leave Kirkbymoorside at 11.15 on M8 towards Danby. Get off at the Lion Inn, Blakey at 11.37 and then catch the M6 from there at 12.15, going down to Rosedale Abbey for a 12.30 arrival (or you could walk down to Rosedale Abbey via the old railway line from near the Lion Inn). Getting back, catch the 14.50 M6 from Rosedale Abbey to Pickering (arr 15.15) and then get on the 128 back to Kirkbymoorside at 15.41. There's a later M6 bus from Rosedale Abbey, leaving at 17.00 which will get you to Pickering at 17.25 for the 128's 17.36 departure for Kirkbymoorside.

Sunday: Leave Kirkbymoorside on 128 at 11.50 to Pickering (arr 12.11). Catch M6 to Rosedale Abbey at 13.00 (arr 13.25). Return either at 16.01 from Rosedale and get off at Ralph Cross / Rosedale road junction (arr 16.14) and then catch M3 direct to Kirkbymoorside at 16.33. Alternatively, catch the M7 from Rosedale (17.05) to Pickering (arr 17.30) and catch the 128 to Kirkbymoorside at 17.41.

Dalby Forest

Visitor centre, cafes, children's play areas, forest trails, bike hire, 'Go Ape' and picnic areas.

Saturday: depart Kirkbymoorside at 10.25 on 128 to Pickering (arr 10.46). Then catch M7 at same bus stop at 10.59 arriving at Dalby Forest Visitor Centre at 11.17. Bus back from Dalby to Pickering at 13.33 (arr 13.51) and then catch M8 from same bus stop (library) at 14.40 back to Kirkbymoorside. A later bus leaves Dalby at 16.10, getting to Pickering at 16.28 and at 16.36 the 128 will pick you up at the same stop and whisk you back to Kirkbymoorside.

Sunday: Depart Kirkbymoorside on M3 at 10.25 to Pickering (arr 10.38) leave Pickering from same bus stop on M7 to Dalby at 11.55 (arr 12.13). Bus back from Dalby at 14.08 or 15.18, arriving Pickering at 14.26 or 15.36. Catch 128 back to Kirkbymoorside at 15.41 (from same stop). Or there's a later Moorsbus M3 at 17.15 to get you back in Kirkbymoorside at 17.30.

Botton Village.... *only if you can manage a steep road walk in and out of Danby Dale.*

Botton Village is a Camphill community. Cafe open 14.30 to 16.30 Saturdays and Sundays. Shop selling items produced in the village open 10.00 – 12.00 Saturdays, closed Sundays.

Saturday: Use M8 departing 11.15. Tell the bus driver you want to go to Botton Village. He'll put you off by the concrete railings seemingly in the middle of nowhere between The Lion Inn and Castleton. Take the steep down hill road on the right, keep walking for 20 -25 minutes and you'll be in Botton. It is a steep hill coming back up also! Return bus at 12.50 or 16.40. Or you can catch the bus from Danby school in Ainthorpe or from Castleton.

Sunday: buses from Kirkbymoorside to Danby leave at 11.45, 12.15, 14.30 and 17.30, but Botton shop or café won't be open. All the timetables are on www.moorsbus.org.
