



MOORSBUS to SUTTON BANK from MALTON

Every Sunday/Bank Holiday in July, August and September 2021)

Moorsbus is a network of friendly public bus services to and through the North York Moors. No need to book – just turn up and pay the driver.

Adult Moors Rover: £9.50

Young Person's Moors Rover: £2.50 (child and young person aged 5 to 18)

Family Moors Rover: £15 (up to 2 adults and 4 children, adult must be accompanied by at least one child)

Rover tickets allow travel all day, anywhere on Moorsbus services M1 to M31 as well as:

Arriva 5, X3, X4, 63, 81, X93; **East Yorkshire** 128 (between Thornton le Dale and Helmsley), ME1 (between Norton and Danby), and **Reliance** 31X

Single journeys

Adult single journey tickets start at £1 (maximum fare for any single journey is £5)

Child / young person single journey ticket: £1 (aged 5 to 18)

Up to 2 children travel free with any adult paying a normal adult fare (single or Rover)

English National Concessionary Travel Passes are accepted on all Moorsbus services

Donate tickets can be bought from the driver for £2, £5 or £10. They're not valid for travel but help Moorsbus grow new services for the future.

Contactless payment available.

How to get to Sutton Bank from Norton and Malton on Sundays & Bank Holidays:

Depart: on Moorsbus M6 outside Norton College at 09.20 (then Hambleton Road, Beverley Road, Mill Street) or outside Malton Railway Station 09.30 (the bus uses normal bus stops thereafter – Old Lodge Hotel; Old Malton; Eden Camp etc)

Get off at Pickering Ropery at 09.50, have a look at the shops and maybe a steam train, public toilets are opposite the bus stop, and then, at the same bus stop, catch the EY 128 at 10.41. Arrive Helmsley at 11.22. Cross road to Co-op stop to catch the M4 at 11.30 to Sutton Bank, arriving 11.45.

Or you can get off at Helmsley and walk 3½ miles along the Cleveland Way to Sutton Bank.

Sutton Bank has an information centre, café, toilets, walks and trails and 'the best view in England'. **Helmsley** has a wonderful castle, Helmsley Walled garden, an open-air swimming pool, the Bird of Prey Centre & Duncombe Park, a brewery, ice creams, and lots of shops and cafes.

How to get home again:

1) M4 Sutton Bank at 15.05, get off at Helmsley Monument 15.20. Then catch EY 128 at 16.30 at the same stop, arrive Pickering Ropery 17.11. Catch the M6 at 17.30 home, arriving Malton Station at 17.50 and Norton at 17.55.

2) Walk back along the Cleveland Way to Helmsley. catch the EY 128 at 16.30, arrive Pickering 17.11, and catch M6 at 17.30 home.

A WALKER'S DAY OUT to SUTTON BANK on Saturdays

Every Saturday in July, August and September 2021

How to get there:

Depart on bus M8 outside Malton Railway Station at 10.30 (the bus uses normal bus stops thereafter – Old Lodge Hotel; Old Malton; Eden Camp etc). Stay on the bus to Kirkbymoorside Market Place at 11.15. There is a connecting M4 bus (at the same stop) at 11.15. It will take you to Helmsley.

Then you have three options:

1. Get off at Helmsley Market Place, ask directions to the Walled Garden, and just before the lane to the Walled Garden, on the edge of the big car-park, you will see the Cleveland Way, waymarked on your right. Follow the Cleveland Way “acorn” signs to the Rievaulx valley road, about 3 miles including two flights of steps, visit the abbey and terraces if you wish, and then double back as far as the river bridge to find the waymark signs for about 4 miles to Sutton Bank, including some rocky / uneven tracks.
2. Alternatively, stay on the bus at Helmsley (11.30) as it heads up to Sutton Bank (arriving 11.45) and then walk the Cleveland Way back to Rievaulx and Helmsley.
3. You could stay on the M4 bus, which will take you first to Sutton Bank (11.45) and then Rievaulx (12.15), from where you can walk along the Cleveland Way to Sutton Bank.

Though the Cleveland Way is quite well way-marked, it is a good idea to take a map, or to download the route on to a mobile phone. Also, wear sturdy shoes or boots, take a waterproof jacket, and take a full water bottle and snacks.

How to get home again:

The M4 bus will return to Rievaulx Abbey at 16.10, Sutton Bank Centre bus stop at 16.40, or Helmsley 16.55. It will then take you to Kirkbymoorside arriving at 17.15 where you change onto the M8 connection to Pickering where at 17.30 the M6 will be waiting to take you back to Malton (17.50) and Norton (18.00).

There are many other walking alternatives as the M4 bus heads up Bilsdale to Stokesley, and then returns in the afternoon. Check the website for more ideas and our full timetables.
