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**Days Out from

Where to catch the bus in Keldholme

All M3 Moorsbuses pick up and set down at Sunnycroft (and opposite Sunnycroft) on Village Street / Grey Lane, 100 metres from the A170.

The bus stops for the 128 are on the main A170 near the junction with the road to Keldholme. On Saturdays there is an M31 Moorsbus to Pickering at 1044: you can catch this at the bus stop on the A170.

SATURDAYS

Danby Lodge National Park Centre (Saturdays)

Catch the M3 at 1117 (opposite Sunnycroft) to Danby. The bus travels through Hutton le Hole and over the moorlands to the Esk Valley and on to Danby Lodge National Park Centre (arrive 1155). (Tea rooms, art gallery, exhibition, shop, info desk, toilets, play areas, picnic sites, bird hide, trails and walks.) Return from Danby on M3 at 1534 (arrive Keldholme 1607).

Hutton le Hole (Saturdays)

Catch the M3 at 1117 (opposite Sunnycroft) to Hutton le Hole (arrive 1123). (Picturesque streamside village with pub, tea rooms and the award-winning Ryedale Folk Museum of over 20 reconstructed historical buildings set in a 6 acre site. Also walks and trails.) Leave Hutton at 1602 for the journey back to Keldholme on M3 (arrive 1607).

WHEN?

Every Saturday, Sunday & Bank Holiday in July, August & September 2022

HOW MUCH?

All-day Moors Rover ticket £9.50 (£2.50 for 5 to 17 year olds)

Family Moors Rover ticket £15 up to 2 adults + 4 children
(adult/s must be accompanied by at least 1 child)

Adult single fares available from just £1 (maximum single fare £5)

Young people (5 to 17) travel for £1 per journey

English National Concessionary Passes accepted

Contactless payment accepted

WHERE?

In towns, Moorsbuses use existing bus stops. In country areas give a clear signal to the driver to get on, and tell the driver where you'd like to get off.

Pickering & Thornton le Dale (Saturdays)

Depart from the A170 main road bus stop in Keldholme at 1044 on bus M31 to Pickering (arrive 1057). Leave Pickering on M7 at 1142 to Thornton le Dale (arrive 1149). (Pubs, tea rooms, car museum as featured in 'Bangers & Cash', walks and trails.) Depart Thornton le Dale on M7 at 1420, arrive Pickering 1427. Leave Pickering on M3 at 1430 for the journey back to Keldholme (arrive 1447).

Dalby: the Great Yorkshire Forest (Saturdays)

Depart from the A170 main road bus stop in Keldholme at 1044 on bus M31 to Pickering (arrive 1057). Leave Pickering on M7 at 1142 to Dalby Forest (arrive 1159). (Cafes, toilets, picnic sites, play areas, Go Ape aerial adventure course, bike hire, walks and trails.) Depart Dalby Forest on M7 at 1410, arrive Pickering 1427. Leave Pickering on M3 at 1430 for the journey back to Keldholme (arrive 1447).

SUNDAYS & BANK HOLIDAYS

Danby Lodge National Park Centre (Sundays & Bank Holidays)

Catch the M3 at 1152 (opposite Sunnycroft) to Danby (arrive 1230). (Tea rooms, art gallery, exhibition, shop, info desk, toilets, play areas, picnic sites, bird hide, trails and walks.) Depart Danby Lodge at 1615 on bus M3 to Keldholme (arrive 1650).

There are lots of great walks from Moorsbus and our website lists many, including: Great Ayton to Stokesley; Lion Inn to Hutton le Hole; Dalby to Thornton le Dale; Blakey to Rosedale Abbey; Sutton Bank to Helmsley, Rievaulx Abbey to Helmsley, etc.

Always plan your walk with care.

Take appropriate food, drink and clothing, a timetable – and a good map.

SUNDAYS & BANK HOLIDAYS

Dalby: the Great Yorkshire Forest (Sundays & Bank Holidays)

Catch the 1020 M3 bus (at *Sunnycroft*) to Pickering (arrive 1040). The M7 will be waiting at the same bus stop and at 1142 will take you to Dalby Forest Visitor Centre (arrive 1159). (Cafes, toilets, picnic sites, play areas, Go Ape aerial adventure course, bike hire, walks and trails.) You could walk from Dalby to Thornton le Dale and catch the bus from there (at 1535).

Leave Dalby Forest on M7 at 1525 (or Thornton le Dale at 1535), getting into Pickering at 1542. (Cafes, pubs, toilets, North Yorkshire steam railway, museum, shops.) Return from Pickering on M3 at 1715, arriving at Keldholme at 1732.

Helmsley & Rievaulx Abbey (Sundays & Bank Holidays)

From the bus stop on the A170, catch the 128 bus at 1100 to Helmsley (arrive 1121). At 1127 depart on M4 to Rievaulx Abbey (arrive 1137). (*English Heritage*: Impressive ruins of Cistercian Abbey in magnificent setting in the Valley of the River Rye. Café, toilets, shop, museum.) From Rievaulx you could walk all the way back to Helmsley (3 miles / 1½ hours) along part of the Cleveland Way. If you're catching the M4 bus back from Rievaulx it departs from outside the abbey at 1332 (arrives Helmsley at 1342).

If you're just planning a short day, leave Helmsley on the 128 at 1430 (getting back to Keldholme at 1446). Otherwise catch the 1630 128 bus from Helmsley and arrive in Keldholme at 1646.

Rievaulx Terrace & Temples and Rievaulx Abbey (Sundays & Bank Holidays)

From the bus stop on the A170, catch the 128 bus at 1100 to Helmsley (arrive 1121). At 1127 depart on M4 to Rievaulx and ask the driver to drop you off at the top of Rievaulx Bank, by the entrance to Rievaulx Terrace & Temples (*National Trust*: please check opening hours: Ionic and Tuscan Temples at each end of a half mile long grass terrace created in the 1750s overlooking Rievaulx Abbey. Toilets, information). A path leading from near the Terrace to the village of Rievaulx and the Abbey. (*English Heritage*: Cistercian Abbey, tea rooms, toilets, museum, shop.) Get the M4 outside the Abbey at 1332 or 1532, arriving in Helmsley at 1342 or 1542. Catch the 1630 128 bus from Helmsley and arrive in Keldholme at 1646.

Thirsk (Sundays and Bank Holidays)

From the bus stop on the A170, catch the 128 bus at 1100 to Helmsley (arrive 1121). Board the M5 at 1131 for the journey to Thirsk, travelling via Ampleforth, Byland Abbey and Coxwold. Arrive in Thirsk at 1209. (Cafes, pubs, shops, toilets, World of James Herriot museum and visitor attraction, walks and trails.) Return from Thirsk at 1534 on M5, getting into Helmsley at 1612. Transfer onto the 128 to Keldholme at 1630, arriving in Keldholme at 1646.

Rievaulx Abbey & Byland Abbey (or Coxwold) (Sundays and Bank Holidays)

From the bus stop on the A170, catch the 128 bus at 1100 to Helmsley (arrive 1121). At 1127 depart on M4 to Rievaulx Abbey (arrive 1137). (*English Heritage*: Impressive ruins of Cistercian Abbey in magnificent setting in the Valley of the River Rye. Café, toilets, shop, museum.) Catch the M4 back to Helmsley at 1332 (arrive 1342). Board the M5 at 1431 for the journey to Byland Abbey (arrive 1450). (*English Heritage*: Cistercian Abbey, museum, free admission). Return to Helmsley on the 1553 M5 bus (arrive Helmsley 1612). Catch the 128 at 1630, arriving in Keldholme at 1646.

Instead of visiting Byland Abbey, you could stay on the M4 to **Coxwold** (arrive at 1453). Shandy Hall and gardens, pub, tea rooms.) Then catch the M4 back from Coxwold at 1550, arriving in Helmsley 1612.

Grand tour: Danby, Guisborough, Bilsdale, Helmsley (Sundays & Bank Holidays)

Catch the M3 at 1152 (*opposite Sunnycroft*) to Danby (arrive 1230). (Tea rooms, art gallery, exhibition, shop, info desk, toilets, play areas, picnic sites, bird hide, trails and walks.) Depart Danby on M3 to Guisborough at 1400 (arrive Guisborough 1426). Stay on this bus (but please re-swipe your ticket or pass) as it becomes M4 for the journey to Great Ayton, Stokesley, Bilsdale, Rievaulx Abbey and Helmsley (arrive 1542). Catch the 128 bus from Helmsley at 1630 and arrive in Keldholme at 1646.

You could extend your day by staying on the M4 bus when it gets to Helmsley at 1542 and travelling up to Sutton Bank (arrive 1600). (*James Herriot's 'Finest View in England'*, tea rooms, toilets, information centre, bike hire, walks and trails.) Depart Sutton Bank on the M4 at 1709 to Helmsley (arrive 1722). (Pubs, cafes, toilets.) Then catch the 1830 128 bus back to Keldholme (arrive 1846).
