



# Days Out from Botton with Moorsbus

**Saturdays, Sundays & Bank Holidays in July, August & September 2022**

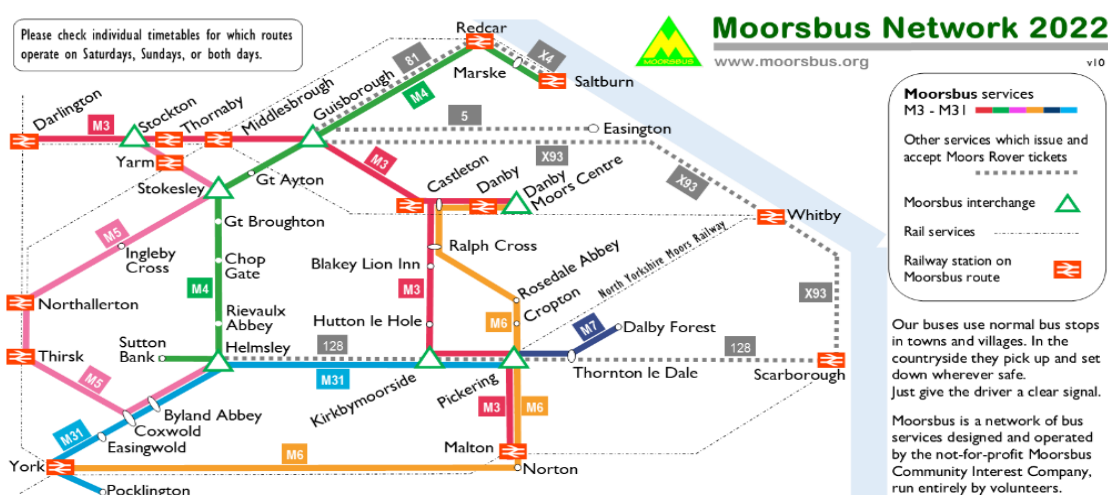
Hello everyone and welcome to Moorsbus 2022: public transport arranged and funded by passengers for the North York Moors and surrounding area.

Moorsbus Community Interest Company and Friends of Moorsbus are all volunteers. We started in 2014, and we are gradually building up public transport.

Of course we really need passengers, because your fares, passes and donations help to fund and expand the services. We hope you have some great days out on Moorsbus in 2022.

Full service details can be found on [www.moorsbus.org](http://www.moorsbus.org), and we can also work with you to produce special printed information for Botton residents. All our buses are wheelchair-friendly.

We run Saturdays, Sundays and Bank Holidays from 2<sup>nd</sup> July to 25<sup>th</sup> September. Services start from Pocklington, York, Redcar, Saltburn, Darlington and Stockton, we hope they are also useful for people wanting to visit you at Botton. This is our network map:



## FARES

All day Moors Rover tickets are £9.50 (£2.50 child / young person 5 – 17). Single fares from just £1. English National Concessionary Passes accepted. Young persons' flat fare single journey ticket £1. Contactless payment usually available. The EY128 / X28 buses sell and accept Moors Rover £9.50 tickets between Helmsley and Scarborough.

Below are some ideas for days out, and there are more over the page. Times given are from Ainthorpe Lane, near Danby School, presuming you can get a lift that far. But those of you who are fairly fit could also walk up Shop Lane to flag the bus down on Castleton Rigg, which is a 30 minute walk from Botton Hall. Our timetable booklets are available from Botton's Café.

## SATURDAYS

### To Hutton-le-Hole

Depart Danby School on M3 at 12.05, get there 12.32, buses back at 14.53, back at Danby school 15.20.

**What's there?** Cafes, pub, ice creams, gift shops, Ryedale Folk Museum, short walks.

### To Rosedale Abbey and Pickering

Leave Danby School on M6 at 1050, arriving in Rosedale Abbey at 1115.

**What's there?** Tea rooms, pub, toilets, Gillies – Jones glass makers' studio, walks.

Get the M6 bus at the same stop in Rosedale Abbey at 1325 for the journey to Pickering (arrive 1349).

**What's there?** Toilets, cafes, pubs, shops, castle, Beck Isle Museum, North Yorkshire Moors Railway.

Catch the 1545 M6 bus back to Danby from outside Pickering library (arrives 1634 (or there's an earlier M3 leaving Pickering at 1430 and getting back to Danby School at 1520).

## SATURDAYS

### To Danby Lodge National Park Centre

Leave Danby School at 10.32, 1318, 1148, 1518 on M3 or M6. The journey takes about 5 minutes.

**What's there?** Art gallery, exhibitions, toilets, café, shop, woodland walks, trails – free admission.

Buses back to Danby School depart Danby Lodge at 1200, 1415, 1530 and 1645.

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### To Dalby Forest and Thornton le Dale

Depart on 1050 M6 bus from Danby School to Pickering. The bus then continues to Dalby Forest Visitor Centre (as service M7), arriving at 1159.

**What's there?** Exhibition, café, play area, toilets, bike hire, Go Ape aerial activities, walks and trails.

Catch the bus from Low Dalby at 1410 to Thornton le Dale (arrive 1420).

**What's there?** Tea rooms, pubs, toilets, car museum, walks.

Get the 1535 M7 bus to Pickering, and stay on for the journey back to Danby (arrive 1634).

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## SUNDAYS

### To Danby Lodge National Park Centre

M3 and M6 Buses leave Danby School at 0932, 1031, 1222, 1302, 1502, 1631 (approx 5 minute journey).

**What's there?** A lovely art gallery and shop, a cafe, bird hides, children's play areas indoors and out, exhibitions, special events, talks, workshops, walks.

M3 and M6 buses back from Danby Lodge at 1045, 1315, 1400, 1615, 1645, 1815

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### To Rievaulx and/or Helmsley.

Depart Danby School on M3 at 0950 to Kirkbymoorside (arrive 1027). (Cafes, toilets). Leave Kirkbymoorside at 1106 on the 128 bus to Helmsley (arrive 1121), The M4 bus to Rievaulx leaves at 1127, getting to Rievaulx Abbey at 1137.

**What's there** Rievaulx Abbey and shop/cafe (English Heritage), Rievaulx Terraces (National Trust).

Two mile walk Rievaulx to Helmsley on the Cleveland Way. At **Helmsley** there is the Castle, Walled Garden, shops, cafes, toilets, an outdoor heated swimming pool, a Birds of Prey Centre and Ice Creams.

M4 buses back from Rievaulx Abbey to Helmsley at 1332 and 1532 (10 minute journey). Then catch the 128 to Pickering at 1430 or 1630. Change on to the Moorsbus at Pickering library at 1545 (M6) or 1715 (M3) (arr Danby School 1634 or 1805)

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### To Thirsk

Depart Danby School on M3 at 0950 to Kirkbymoorside (arrive 1027). (Cafes, toilets). Leave Kirkbymoorside at 1106 on the 128 bus to Helmsley (arrive 1121), The M5 to Thirsk leaves at 1131, arriving at 1209.

**What's there?** Shops, toilets, cafes, pubs and the World of James Herriot.

Getting back, catch the 1534 M5 from Thirsk Market Place, arriving in Helmsley at 1612. Here you change on to the 128 at 1630 to Pickering (arrive 1706). The final leg of the journey is on the M3 which leaves Pickering library at 1715, getting you back to Danby School at 1805.

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### A grand tour for bus lovers

Depart 1405 from Danby School on M3 to Guisborough and stay on the bus as it travels through Bilsdale to Rievaulx Abbey and Helmsley (arrive 1542). In Helmsley catch the 128 at 1630 to Pickering (arrive 1706). The final leg of the journey is on the M3 which leaves Pickering library at 1715, getting you back to Danby School at 1805.

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### To Pickering, Thornton le Dale or Dalby Forest

Depart 1050 on M6 to Pickering, (arrive 11.39). Stay on this bus if you want to go to Thornton le Dale and Dalby Forest (arrives Thornton le Dale at 1149 or Dalby Forest at 1159).

**What's there? Dalby Forest** (toilets, walks, cycle hire, Go Ape, a junior go ape, outdoor play area, a shop, exhibitions and café. Or walk back to **Thornton-le-Dale** (toilets, shops, cafes and car museum).

**Pickering** has Beck Isle Musuem, castle, cafes, toilets, steam railway and shops.

Leave Dalby Forest on M7 at 1410 or 1525, Thornton le Dale at 1420 or 1535 to Pickering. In Pickering get the M6 at 1545 or M3 at 1715 getting you back to Danby School at 1634 or 1805.

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
