



# Days Out from Hutton le Hole with Moorsbus

## Saturdays, Sundays & Bank Holidays in July, August & September 2022

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Moorsbus is a network of friendly, wheelchair accessible, public bus services to and through the North York Moors designed and operated by a not-for-profit Community Interest Company on behalf of passengers and the community.

- English National Concessionary Passes accepted.
- Adult single fares available from just £1, and all child single fares are just £1.
- All day Moors Rover tickets are £9.50 (£2.50 for 5 to 17 year olds).
- Contactless payment available.
- Well-behaved dogs welcome.

The EYB 128 & X28 bus service sells and accepts Moors Rover tickets between Helmsley and Scarborough, as does the ME1 between Norton and Danby.

In towns, Moorsbuses use existing bus stops. In country areas, give a clear signal to the driver to get on, and tell the driver in advance where you'd like to get off.

Buses to Danby leave from OPPOSITE the Folk Museum; buses to Kirkbymoorside and Pickering leave from OUTSIDE the Folk Museum.

**Pick up a full timetable from the Folk Museum. We're always keen to receive your feedback.**

### **SATURDAY Danby Lodge National Park Centre**

Leave Hutton le Hole (opposite the folk museum) at 1123 on bus M3 to Danby Lodge. The bus arrives in Danby at 1155. Exhibition, art gallery, shop, information, tea rooms, toilets, picnic sites, bird hides, play areas and lots of trails and walks – free admission. Catch the 1530 M3 back to Hutton le Hole (arrive 1602).

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### **SATURDAY Pickering**

Catch the M3 outside the folk museum at 1232 arriving in Pickering 1255. Castle, Beck Isle Museum, steam railway, cafes, shops, toilets. Return to Hutton le Hole at 1430 (arrive 1453).

You could take a short trip to the picturesque village of Thornton le Dale with its car museum, tea rooms, shops and toilets. 128 bus leaves Pickering at 1306 (arrive Thornton le Dale 1317). Return from Thornton le Dale to Pickering at 1410 (arrive Pickering 1417) and then catch the M3 at 1430 (back in Hutton le Hole at 1453).

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### **SUNDAY & BANK HOLIDAY Danby Lodge National Park Centre**

Catch the 1158 M3 to Danby (arrives 1230). (Exhibition, tea rooms, toilets, art gallery, information, shop, picnic sites, play areas, bird hides, trails and woodland walks – free admission). Several easy walks around the area to keep you active (details at the National Park Centre). Leave Danby on M3 at 1615, arriving in Hutton le Hole at 1647.

(If you just want an afternoon visit to Danby, get the bus from Hutton le Hole at 1438 (arrive Danby 1510), return from Danby at 1615 (arrive Hutton le Hole 1647).

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### **SUNDAY & BANK HOLIDAY Dalby Forest, Thornton le Dale and Pickering**

Catch the 1017 M3 to Pickering (arrives 1040). Depart Pickering on M7 at 1142 to Dalby Forest (arrive Low Dalby Visitor Centre at 1159). Information, café, toilets, bike hire Go Ape aerial activities, picnic sites, play areas, walks and trails. Return from Dalby Forest at 1410 to Thornton le Dale (arrive 1420). Tea rooms, pubs, toilets, souvenir shops, car museum. Depart Thornton le Dale at 1535 to Pickering (arrive 1542). Castle, steam railway, Beck Isle Museum, cafes, pubs, shops, toilets). Depart Pickering on bus M3 at 1715 (arrive Hutton le Hole 1738).

(You could spend longer at Dalby Forest (1159 to 1525); or spend the time at Thornton le Dale (1149 to 1535).

**SUNDAY & BANK HOLIDAY Grand Tour of the Moors (Danby, Stokesley, Bilsdale, Rievaulx, Helmsley)**

Depart Hutton le Hole on M3 at 1158. Your tour travels over the central moorlands, passing the isolated Lion Inn and Ralph Cross (symbol of the National Park), before heading down Castleton Rigg to the Esk Valley (arrive Danby Lodge National Park Centre at 1230). Tea rooms, toilets, exhibitions, art gallery, picnic areas, trails, play areas etc. Leave Danby at 1400 on M3 to Guisborough (1426) and then the same bus goes to Great Ayton and Stokesley before heading down Bilsdale, through the village of Chop Gate and on to majestic Rievaulx Abbey and the market town of Helmsley (arrive 1542). Tea rooms, toilets, shops, castle, walled garden, Birds of Prey Centre. Catch the 128 to Kirkbymoorside at 1630, get off at Kirkbymoorside (1645). Tea rooms, toilets, pubs. Then board the M3 to Hutton le Hole at 1730, getting back to Hutton le Hole at 1738.

**SUNDAY & BANK HOLIDAY Rievaulx Abbey and Helmsley**

Catch the M3 at 1017 from Hutton le Hole to Kirkbymoorside (arrive 1027). Cafes, toilets, pubs. At 1106 catch the 128 bus to Helmsley (arrive 1121). Get the M4 from Helmsley at 1127 to Rievaulx Abbey (wonderful Cistercian Abbey, tea rooms, toilets, shop and small museum). Get the M4 to Helmsley at 1332 or 1532, arriving into Helmsley at 1342 or 1542. Enjoy a stroll around Helmsley, a bite to eat in one of the cafes or pubs before getting the 128 bus back from Helmsley at 1630 to Pickering (arrives Pickering 1706). The M3 to Hutton le Hole leaves Pickering at 1715, getting back to Hutton le Hole at 1738.

You could, of course, spend the whole time in Helmsley, arriving at 1121. (Birds of Prey Centre, Walled Garden English Heritage Castle, tea rooms, pubs, brewery, shops and toilets. and then catching the bus back from Helmsley at 1630.

**SUNDAY & BANK HOLIDAY Thirsk**

Catch the M3 at 1017 from Hutton le Hole to Kirkbymoorside (arrive 1027). Cafes, toilets, pubs. At 1106 catch the 128 bus to Helmsley (arrive 1121). Depart Helmsley on M5 at 1131 to Thirsk (arrive 1209). Cafes, pubs, shops, toilets, World of James Herriot. Leave Thirsk Market Place on M5 at 1534 to Helmsley (arrive 1612), Change on to 128 to Pickering (departs 1630) arrive Pickering 1706, the the final leg home on the M3 which leaves Pickering at 1715 and gets back to Hutton le Hole at 1738.

**SUNDAY & BANK HOLIDAY Coxwold and Byland Abbey**

Catch the M3 at 1017 from Hutton le Hole to Kirkbymoorside (arrive 1027). Cafes, toilets, pubs. At 1106 catch the 128 bus to Helmsley (arrive 1121). Depart Helmsley on M5 at 1131 to Coxwold (arrive 1153). Wonderful village with Shandy Hall (home of author Laurence Sterne), church, tea rooms and Fauconberg Arms. At 1250 catch the M5 bus for the 3 minute journey back to Byland Abbey. Magnificent Cistercian Abbey also Byland Abbey Inn (for refreshments). Depart Byland on M5 at 1553 to Helmsley (arrive 1612), then catch the 128 back to Pickering at 1630 (arrive 1706). The final leg home is on the M3 which leaves Pickering at 1715 and gets back to Hutton le Hole at 1738.

**SUNDAY & BANK HOLIDAY Great Ayton or Stokesley**

Catch the M3 at 1017 from Hutton le Hole to Kirkbymoorside (arrive 1027). Cafes, toilets, pubs. At 1106 catch the 128 bus to Helmsley (arrive 1121). The M4 bus leaves Helmsley at 1127 for the journey through Bilsdale to Stokesley (arrive 1214) and Great Ayton (1227). Shops, tea rooms, pubs in each, plus the Captain Cook Schoolhouse Museum in Great Ayton. Return journeys on the M4 are from Great Ayton at 1443 or Stokesley at 1454, getting into Helmsley at 1542. Time for a 45 minute break in Helmsley before catching the 128 back to Kirkbymoorside at 1630 (arrive 1645). Then get the M3 which leaves Kirkbymoorside at 1730 and gets back to Hutton le Hole at 1738.
