



Days Out from Malton & Norton with Moorsbus

Saturdays, Sundays & Bank Holidays in July, August & September 2022

Moorsbus is a network of friendly, wheelchair accessible, public bus services to and through the North York Moors designed and operated by a not-for-profit Community Interest Company on behalf of passengers and the community.

- English National Concessionary Passes accepted.
- Adult single fares available from just £1, and all child single fares are just £1.
- All day Moors Rover tickets are £9.50 (£2.50 for 5 to 17 year olds).
- Family Moors Rover £15: up to 2 adults + 4 children (adult(s) must be accompanied by at least 1 child)
- Contactless payment available.
- Well-behaved dogs welcome.

The EYB 128 & X28 bus service sells and accepts Moors Rover tickets between Helmsley and Scarborough, as does the ME1 between Norton and Danby.

In towns, Moorsbuses use existing bus stops. In country areas, give a clear signal to the driver to get on, and tell the driver in advance where you'd like to get off.

The route through Norton is: Norton College; Langley Drive; Hambleton Road; Beverley Road; Mill Street; Commercial Street; Railway Station (Moorsbus picks up and sets down at all normal bus stops)

SATURDAY Danby Lodge National Park Centre

Leave Norton College at 0911 or Malton Railway Station at 0922 on bus M6 to Danby, calling at Pickering (0945), Rosedale Abbey (1009) and arriving at Danby Lodge (1039). Exhibition, art gallery, shop, information, tea rooms, toilets, picnic sites, bird hides, play areas and lots of trails and walks – free admission. Catch the 1645 M6 to Pickering (1743) and stay on board as it heads to Malton (1803) and Norton (1814).

Danby Lodge National Park Centre – short visit. Instead of leaving Danby at 1645, you could leave Danby at 1200 on M3, arriving at Malton Railway Station at 1318 (this bus does not go on to Norton).

SATURDAY Danby Lodge National Park Centre and Hutton le Hole

Leave Norton College at 0911 or Malton Railway Station at 0922 on bus M6 to Danby, calling at Pickering (0945), Rosedale Abbey (1009) and arriving at Danby Lodge (1039). Exhibition, art gallery, shop, information, tea rooms, toilets, picnic sites, bird hides, play areas and lots of trails and walks – free admission. Catch the 1200 M3 bus to Hutton le Hole (arrive 1232). Tea rooms, pub, Ryedale Folk Museum (reconstructed historical buildings on 6 acre site), walks. Leave Hutton le Hole at 1602 on M3 to Pickering (arrive 1625). At Pickering catch the 1743 M6 bus to Malton (1803) and Norton (1814).

SATURDAY Rosedale Abbey, Dalby Forest & Thornton le Dale

Leave Norton College at 0911 or Malton Railway Station at 0922 on bus M6 to Pickering (0945) and Rosedale Abbey (1009). Tea rooms, internationally renowned glass makers studio of Gillies-Jones, toilets and walks. Depart Rosedale Abbey on M6 at 1115 to Pickering (1139) and stay on the bus to Thornton le Dale (1149) and Low Dalby Visitor Centre in Dalby Forest (toilets, tea rooms, picnic sites, play areas, bike hire, Go Ape aerial activities, walks. Leave Low Dalby at 1410 to Thornton le Dale (1420). Tea rooms, souvenir shops, pubs, toilets, car museum. Depart Thornton le Dale at 1535 on M7 bus to Pickering (arrive 1542). Leave Pickering at 1743) on M6 to Malton (1803) and Norton (1814).

On Saturdays and Sundays enjoy a '**walk&ride**' between some of our beautiful and spectacular destinations such as Rievaulx Abbey to Helmsley, Dalby Forest to Thornton le Dale. See www.moorsbus.org for details.

SUNDAY & BANK HOLIDAY Danby Lodge National Park Centre

Leave Norton College at 0911 or Malton Railway Station at 0922 on bus M6 to Danby, calling at Pickering (0945), Rosedale Abbey (1009) and arriving at Danby Lodge (1039). Exhibition, art gallery, shop, information, tea rooms, toilets, picnic sites, bird hides, play areas and lots of trails and walks – free admission. Catch the 1645 M6 to Pickering (1740) and stay on board as it heads to Malton (1803) and Norton (1814).

SUNDAY & BANK HOLIDAY Helmsley & Rievaulx Abbey

Leave Norton College at 0911 or Malton Railway Station at 0922 on bus M6 to Pickering (0945), Leave Pickering at 1041 on the 128 bus to Helmsley (arrive 1121). Get the M4 from Helmsley at 1127 to Rievaulx Abbey (1137). Wonderful Cistercian Abbey, cafe, toilets, shop, small museum. *You could walk back to Helmsley along the Cleveland Way (3 miles 1.5 hours).* Or leave Rievaulx Abbey on M4 at 1332 to Helmsley (1342). Cafes, pubs, Birds of Prey Centre, castle, Walled Garden. Leave Helmsley at 1630 on the 128 bus to Pickering (arrive 1706). At 1743 catch the M6 back to Malton (1803) and Norton (1814).

SUNDAY & BANK HOLIDAY Rosedale Abbey, Dalby Forest & Thornton le Dale

Leave Norton College at 0911 or Malton Railway Station at 0922 on bus M6 to Pickering (0945) and Rosedale Abbey (1009). Tea rooms, internationally renowned glass makers studio of Gillies-Jones, toilets and walks. Depart Rosedale Abbey on M6 at 1115 to Pickering (1142) and stay on the bus to Thornton le Dale (1149) and Low Dalby Visitor Centre in Dalby Forest (toilets, tea rooms, picnic sites, play areas, bike hire, Go Ape aerial activities, walks. Leave Low Dalby at 1410 to Thornton le Dale (1420). Tea rooms, pubs, toilets, car museum. Depart Thornton le Dale at 1535 on M7 bus to Pickering (arrive 1542). Leave Pickering at 1743 on M6 to Malton (1803) and Norton (1814). (You could spend longer at Dalby Forest (1159 to 1525); or spend the time at Thornton le Dale (1149 to 1535).

SUNDAY & BANK HOLIDAY Grand Tour of the Moors (Danby, Stokesley, Bilsdale, Rievaulx, Helmsley)

Leave Norton College at 0911 or Malton Railway Station at 0922 on bus M6 to Pickering (0945), Leave Pickering at 1135 on bus M3 to Danby. You travel over the central moorlands, passing the Lion Inn and Ralph Cross, before heading down to the Esk Valley (arrive Danby 1230). Tea rooms, toilets, exhibitions, art gallery, picnic areas, trails, play areas etc. Leave Danby at 1400 on M3 to Guisborough (1426) and then the same bus goes to Great Ayton, Stokesley, Bilsdale, on to majestic Rievaulx Abbey and the market town of Helmsley (arrive 1542). Tea rooms, toilets, shops, castle, walled garden, Birds of Prey Centre. Leave Helmsley at 1630 on the 128 bus to Pickering (arrive 1706). At 1743 catch the M6 back to Malton (1803) and Norton (1814).

SUNDAY & BANK HOLIDAY Thirsk

Leave Norton College at 0911 or Malton Railway Station at 0922 on bus M6 to Pickering (0942), Leave Pickering at 1041 on the 128 to Helmsley (arrive 1121). Depart Helmsley on M5 at 1131 to Thirsk (1209). Cafes, pubs, shops, toilets, World of James Herriot. Leave Thirsk Market Place on M5 at 1534 to Helmsley (1612), Leave Helmsley at 1630 on the 128 bus to Pickering (1706). At 1743 catch the M6 back to Malton (1803) and Norton (1814).

SUNDAY & BANK HOLIDAY Coxwold and Byland Abbey

Leave Norton College at 0911 or Malton Railway Station at 0922 on bus M6 to Pickering (0945), Leave Pickering at 1041 on the 128 bus to Helmsley (arrive 1121). Depart Helmsley on M5 at 1131 to Coxwold (arrive 1153). Wonderful village with Shandy Hall (home of author Laurence Sterne), church, tea rooms and Fauconberg Arms. At 1250 catch the M5 bus for the 3 minute journey back to Byland Abbey. Magnificent Cistercian Abbey also Byland Abbey Inn. Depart Byland Abbey on M5 at 1553 to Helmsley (arrive 1612). Leave Helmsley at 1630 on the 128 bus to Pickering (arrive 1706). At 1743 catch the M6 back to Malton (1803) and Norton (1814).

SUNDAY & BANK HOLIDAY Great Ayton or Stokesley

Leave Norton College at 0911 or Malton Railway Station at 0922 on bus M6 to Pickering (0945), Leave Pickering at 1041 on the 128 bus to Helmsley (arrive 1121). Depart on bus M4 at 1127 to Stokesley (arrive 1214) and Great Ayton (1227). Shops, tea rooms, pubs in each, plus the Captain Cook Schoolhouse Museum in Great Ayton. Return on the M4 from Great Ayton at 1443 or Stokesley at 1454, arrive Helmsley at 1542. Leave Helmsley at 1630 on the 128 bus to Pickering (arrive 1706). At 1743 catch the M6 back to Malton (1803) and Norton (1814).
