

Days Out from Northallerton with Moorsbus

Saturdays, Sundays & Bank Holidays in July, August & September 2022

Moorsbus is a network of friendly, wheelchair accessible, public bus services to and through the North York Moors designed and operated by a not-for-profit Community Interest Company.

All-day Moors Rover tickets are £9.50 (£2.50 child). Single fares from just £1. English National Concessionary Passes accepted. Contactless payment usually available. The EY128 buses sell and accept Moors Rover £9.50 tickets.

In towns, Moorsbuses use existing bus stops. In country areas, give a clear signal to the driver to get on, and tell the driver in advance where you'd like to get off.

Here are some suggested days out from Northallerton.

SUNDAY & BANK HOLIDAY Helmsley and Rievaulx Abbey

Catch the 1014 M5 from Buck Inn, Northallerton (1018 at the railway station), get off in Helmsley at 1122. Enjoy the shops, pubs, tea rooms, toilets, castle, walled garden or Birds of Prey Centre. Leave Helmsley on M4 at 1427 to Rievaulx Abbey (arriving at 1437). Café, information and toilets at this outstanding Cistercian Abbey. Leave Rievaulx at 1532 on M4 to Helmsley (arrive 1542).). Catch the M5 for the return journey from Helmsley at 1631, arriving in Northallerton at 1739.

SUNDAY & BANK HOLIDAY Pickering and Dalby Forest (or Thornton le Dale)

Catch the 1014 M5 from Buck Inn, Northallerton (1018 at the railway station), get off in Helmsley at 1122.

Catch the 128 from Helmsley to Pickering at 1130 (arrive 1206). Leave Pickering on M7 to Dalby Forest at 1352, arriving at Low Dalby Visitor Centre at 1409. (If you want to visit Thornton le Dale, get off the M7 at Thornton le Dale village green at 1400 (toilets, tea rooms, pubs, car museum) getting the bus back to Pickering at 1535.) If you're visiting Dalby Forest, enjoy the café, play areas, walks and trails or even the GoApe aerial activities before leaving Dalby at 1525 on M7 to Pickering (arrive at 1542) and change on to the 1545 128 back to Helmsley (arrive 1621). The bus to Northallerton departs Helmsley at 1631, getting into Northallerton at 1739.

SUNDAY & BANK HOLIDAY Helmsley, Rievaulx and Byland Abbeys

Catch the 1014 M5 from Buck Inn, Northallerton (1018 at the railway station), get off in Helmsley at 1122. The M4 to Rievaulx leaves at 1127, getting to Rievaulx Abbey at 1137. Depart Rievaulx Abbey at 1332 for Helmsley, and then catch the M5 at 1431 from Helmsley to Byland Abbey (arrive 1450). The M5 leaves Byland at 1650, getting to Northallerton at 1739.

SUNDAY & BANK HOLIDAY Danby Moors Centre and circular tour of the moors

Catch the 1014 M5 from Buck Inn, Northallerton (1018 at the railway station), get off in Helmsley at 1122 and catch the 128 which leaves Helmsley at 1130. Get off in Kirkbymoorside and change on to the 1150 M3 to Danby Moors Centre (arrive 1230). Free admission to the Moors Centre with its exhibition, art gallery, tea rooms, toilets, shop, picnic sites, play areas and walks and trails. Leave Danby at 1400 on M3 to Guisborough, and on through Bilsdale to Rievaulx Abbey and Helmsley (arrive Helmsley 1542). Tea rooms, pubs, toilets, shops, castle, walled garden, Birds of Prey Centre). Catch the M5 for the return journey from Helmsley at 1631, arriving in Northallerton at 1739.

SUNDAY & BANK HOLIDAY Hutton le Hole and Pickering

Catch the 1014 M5 from Buck Inn, Northallerton (1018 at the railway station), get off in Helmsley at 1122. Catch the 1130 128 to Kirkbymoorside (arrive 1145) and change on to the 1150 M3 to Hutton le Hole (arrive 1158). Tea rooms, pub, toilets and the award-winning Ryedale Folk Museum with reconstructed buildings from the Iron Age to the 1950s. Depart Hutton le Hole at 1347 on the M3 to Pickering, arriving at 1410. Shops, pubs, castle, tea rooms, toilets, Beck Isle Museum, North Yorkshire Moors Railway, medieval wall paintings in parish church. Leave Pickering on the 128 to Helmsley at 1545, arriving in Helmsley at 1621 for the 1631 M5 back to Northallerton (arrive 1739).

SUNDAY & BANK HOLIDAY Stokesley or Great Ayton

Catch the 1014 M5 from Buck Inn, Northallerton (1018 at the railway station), get off in Helmsley at 1122. Board the 1127 M4 and get off in Stokesley (arrive 1214) or Great Ayton (arrive 1227). Pubs, cafes, shops, and pleasant walks at each, plus the Captain Cook Schoolhouse Museum in Great Ayton. Return on M4 to Helmsley from Great Ayton at 1443, or from Stokesley at 1454. Arrives Helmsley at 1542, and then catch the M5 at 1631 back to Northallerton (arrive 1739).

SUNDAY & BANK HOLIDAY Coxwold and Helmsley

Catch the 1014 M5 from Buck Inn, Northallerton (1018 at the railway station), get off in Coxwold at 1100. The church, Shandy Hall (eighteenth century home of the author Laurence Sterne) and its gardens are well worth visiting, as is the Fauconberg Arms or the tearooms. If you're having a Sunday lunch here you could catch the 1453 back to Thirsk (arrive 1509) for a couple of hours at the shops, cafes or World of James Herriot, and then on to Northallerton at 1714 (arrive 1739). If you're only in Coxwold for a short stay, catch the 1250 to Helmsley (arrive1312) and after an afternoon in Helmsley, depart Helmsley on M5 at 1631, arriving in Northallerton at 1739.

Dalby Forest to Thornton le Dale (4 miles; 2 hours)

Great Ayton to Stokesley (3 miles; 1.25 hours)

Blakey Lion Inn to Hutton le Hole (8.5 miles; 4 hours)

Rievaulx to Helmsley (3 miles; 1.5 hours)
