



Sundays out from Scarborough

with Moorsbus in partnership with East Yorkshire

Sundays & Bank Holidays in July, August & September 2022

Moorsbus is a network of friendly, wheelchair accessible, public bus services to and through the North York Moors designed and operated by a not-for-profit Community Interest Company.

All day Moors Rover tickets are £9.50 (£2.50 child). Single fares from just £1. English National Concessionary Passes accepted. Contactless payment usually available. The EY128 bus service and Arriva 5, 63, 81, X3, X4, X93 sell and accept Moors Rover £9.50 tickets.

In towns, Moorsbuses use existing bus stops. In country areas, give a clear signal to the driver to get on, and tell the driver in advance where you'd like to get off.

Here are some suggested days out.

Each trip starts with a journey on East Yorkshire's 128 service from outside Scarborough Railway Station and then connects with other buses taking you to some of the highlights of the North York Moors. It's just the ticket for a great day out.

SUNDAY & BANK HOLIDAY Pickering, Hutton le Hole and Danby

Catch the 128 from outside Scarborough Station at 0945 and get off in Pickering at 1045. Explore some of Pickering's shops or cafes, before getting the M3 Moorsbus at 1130 from the same stop where you got off. Get off the bus at 1153 in the picturesque streamside village of Hutton le Hole (pub, cafes, toilets and the award-winning six acre Ryedale Folk Museum with reconstructed buildings from the Iron Age to the 1950s.) At 1438 catch the M3 Moorsbus from opposite the Folk Museum to Danby (arriving at 1510). The Moors Centre has tea rooms, toilets, information, art gallery, shop, exhibition, trails, picnic sites and play area – admission is free. Catch the M3 Moorsbus at 1615 back to Pickering for the 1710 128 connection back to Scarborough. (There's a later bus to Scarborough from Pickering at 1910 if you want to make a longer day.)

SUNDAY & BANK HOLIDAY Thirsk and Herriot Country

Catch the 128 from outside Scarborough station at 0945 (arrive Helmsley 1121). At 1131 catch the M5 from Helmsley Market Place (outside the co-op) to Thirsk, travelling through Herriot Country and passing Ampleforth, Byland Abbey and Coxwold (arriving in Thirsk at 1209). Pubs, cafes, shops and the World of James Herriot. Return to Helmsley on M5 at 1534 (leaving from the Market Place and arriving Helmsley 1612). Change onto the 128 for Scarborough which leaves Helmsley at 1630, arriving in Scarborough at 1808.

SUNDAY & BANK HOLIDAY **Walk & Ride** – check our website for these and other walk details

Rievaulx to Helmsley (3 miles; 1.5 hours)

128 Scarborough (depart 1145) to Helmsley (arrive 1321). M4 to Rievaulx (depart Helmsley 1427) arrive Rievaulx 1437. Walk to Helmsley. 128 Helmsley (depart 1630) arrive Scarborough 1808.

Dalby Forest to Thornton le Dale (4 miles; 2 hours)

128 Scarborough (depart 1245) to Thornton le Dale (arrive 1334). Depart Thornton le Dale on M7 to Dalby at 1359 (arriving 1409). Walk to Thornton le Dale. Depart Thornton le Dale on 128 at 1717 for Scarborough (arriving at 1808).

Sutton Bank to Rievaulx (7.25 miles; 3 hours)

128 Scarborough (depart 1145) to Helmsley (arrive 1321). Depart Helmsley at 1347 on M4 to Sutton Bank (arrive 1400). Walk to Helmsley via Rievaulx. Depart Helmsley at 1830 on 128 to Scarborough (arriving 2008).

Great Ayton to Stokesley (3 miles; 1.25 hours)

128 Scarborough (depart 0945) to Helmsley (arrive 1121); M4 Helmsley (depart 1127) to Great Ayton (arrive 1227). Walk to Stokesley. M4 Stokesley (depart 1454) to Helmsley (arrive 1547). 128 depart Helmsley at 1630, arrive Scarborough at 1808.

Always plan your walk with care. Take appropriate food, drink and clothing – and a good map.

SUNDAY & BANK HOLIDAY **The best of the North York Moors on a circular tour**

Catch the 128 from outside Scarborough Station at 0945 and get off in Pickering at 1045. Enjoy a coffee and cake or explore some of Pickering's shops, before getting the M3 Moorsbus at 1130 (from the same stop where you got off). The M3 travels through Hutton le Hole and over the moorland to arrive at Danby Moors Centre at 1225 (tea rooms, shop, toilets, art gallery, play area, trails, info desk – free admission). Catch the M3 Moorsbus to Guisborough and continue on to Great Ayton, Stokesley, through Bilsdale and past Rievaulx Abbey, arriving in Helmsley at 1542 (cafes, pubs, shops, toilets). Your return 128 to Scarborough leaves Helmsley at 1630, arriving in Scarborough at 1808.

SUNDAY & BANK HOLIDAY **Thornton le Dale, Dalby Forest and Pickering**

Catch the 128 at 1145 from Scarborough to Thornton le Dale where you get off at 1234. A lovely village with craft shops, tea rooms, ice creams, toilets – and home to the Car Museum featured in the TV series 'Bangers and Cash'. After a spot of lunch, catch the M7 at 1359 to Dalby Forest (from the same bus stop you got off earlier). The bus takes you to Low Dalby Visitor Centre with play areas, café, toilets, the aerial excitement of Go Ape and lots of places to walk and explore. Catch the M7 from Low Dalby at 1525 for the journey to Pickering (arrive 1542). Explore Pickering's shops and attractions before catching the 128 back to Scarborough at 1710 (arrive 1808).
