



DAYS OUT FROM REDCAR WITH MOORSBUS

Every Saturday, Sunday & Bank Holiday 3 May to 29 September 2019

Moorsbus is a friendly and wheelchair accessible public transport network to and through the North York Moors National Park. No need to book – just turn up and pay the driver, cash or card; contactless available on most buses. English National Concessionary Passes accepted. Local fares are available from just £1.00. All day Moors Rover tickets are £9.50 (up to 4 children travel free with each fare-paying adult). Arriva 5, 63, 81, X3, X4, X93, EY128 (Scarborough to Helmsley) and Reliance 31X (Helmsley – York) also sell and accept MoorsRover £9.50 tickets. Dogs welcome but not on seats. **More information and ideas on www.moorsbus.org**

A To Rievaulx Abbey on Saturdays depart on M1, Redcar High Street East bus stop, at 09.05 . Stay on the same bus. It becomes the M3 at Guisborough and the M4 at Kirkbymoorside, and it takes you along Blakey Ridge with stunning views of Danby Dale, Rosedale and Farndale. You will reach Rievaulx Abbey at 11.25. The bus can either drop you at the top of Rievaulx Bank, to visit the Rievaulx Terraces, or you **can stay on the bus to go directly to the Abbey**. The Rievaulx Terraces have a small shop with ticket kiosk, and you'll be rewarded with wonderful views and two National Trust monuments. Back outside the entrance gate again, a track takes you down into the lovely village of Rievaulx. Continue along the road through the village to the Abbey. It is an English Heritage site, including a large indoor cafe and shop area with stunning views of the Abbey, and a separate indoor Museum area that is in the grounds of the Abbey. Staff at ticket desk provide audio guides for the full site.

How to get home again:- On **Saturdays** here are a few options heading back:-

- 1) The M4 bus will return at 15.12, on the same side of the road, and pick up at Rievaulx Terraces (at their first entrance gate) and at Rievaulx Abbey car park entrance. The same bus changes numbers but takes you all the way back to Redcar.
- 2) Walk 4 miles along the Cleveland Way to Sutton Bank & Visitor Centre, It is waymarked, but please download route instructions or take a map. Same M4 collects you at Sutton Bank Visitor Centre stop, 15.37 and takes you to Redcar, arrive 18.15.
- 3) Walk 3.2 miles the other way along the Cleveland Way to Helmsley, where there are lots of shops, cafes, pubs and ice creams. Catch the M4, by Monument, at 16.15.

Rievaulx Abbey or Sutton Bank on Sundays and Bank Holidays

Similar to Saturday, but you leave Redcar at 08.50. Stay on the same bus, but the Sunday route is via Great Ayton and through Bilsdale, arrive Rievaulx 10.24 or Sutton Bank 10.49. On Sundays and Bank Hols, there are buses from Rievaulx to Helmsley at 14.14, 14.40 16.05; and buses Sutton Bank to Helmsley at 11.05, 14.05. Last bus from Sutton Bank is 17.10, which calls at Helmsley 17.25, Rievaulx 17.35, and takes you all the way to Redcar for 19.15.

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B Hutton le Hole. On Saturdays, depart on M1, Redcar High Street East bus stop, at 09.05. Stay on the same bus. It becomes the M3 at Guisborough, and then takes you over the moors to Hutton-le-Hole, arriving 10.37. The bus stops outside the award-winning Ryedale Folk Museum a six acre site with 20 historic buildings to explore, as well as displays, free art gallery and discovery trail. This picturesque village also has gift shops, cafes, a pub, a church and nice walks. The energetic can walk to lovely Lastingham, and back, in about 2 hours, or walk to Kirkbymoorside via Gillamoor. Download walk route or take a map. Going home on Saturdays, the same bus will pick you up at 16.30 in Kirkbymoorside or Hutton le Hole at 16.40.

Sundays and Bank Holidays, depart Redcar 08.50, change to M3 at Guisborough at 09.15 (The buses wait for each other) Arrive Hutton-le-Hole at 10.27. There will be car boot sales at Hutton-le-Hole on 30th June, 7th, 21st, 28th July, 11th & 18th August, 1st & 8th September. To come home, M3 leaves Hutton-le-Hole at 17.35. Change to M1 at Guisborough 18.37. (The buses wait for each other). Redcar 19.01.

C The Moors National Park Centre, Danby As for Hutton above, on Saturdays depart Redcar 09.05; bus arrives Danby NP Centre 10am. Depart at 17.15, arrive Redcar 18.15. On Sundays and Bank Hols depart 08.50. Change at Guisborough to M3, arrive Danby NP Centre 09.50. Depart 18.07 on M3, change at Guisborough to M1 at 18.37, arrive Redcar 19.01.

There is lots to do and see at the National Park Centre; admission is free. Walks, exhibitions, events, bird hide, woodland trails, shop, tea room, gallery, and information centre with very helpful staff. Danby is situated in the lovely Esk Valley lovely, and you could also get off at Castleton or Danby village to explore and/or try the pubs. From Danby village you can easily get to Whitby on the Esk Valley Railway.

D Rosedale Abbey, Pickering or Dalby Forest, Sundays and Bank Holidays

Go to Danby NP Centre but then catch M6 10.35. Arrive Rosedale Abbey 11.05, a small village with tea rooms, and a church, and Rosedale is famous for its iron-stone mining history. **OR stay on bus** to the popular Market Town of Pickering 11.30, **or** Dalby Forest Visitor Centre 11.47, where you'll find displays, play areas, "Go Ape" high zip wires, walks, cycle hire, café and a big indoor lounge to shelter if the rain comes. You can walk to charming Thornton-le-Dale, via Ellerburn, from either Dalby Forest Visitor Centre or Dalby Haygate Carpark. The Visitor centre sell £1 walk or cycle route maps. Return M7/M6 15.20 at Dalby, 15.30 Thornton, 16.00 Pickering, 16.25 Rosedale Abbey. Arrive Danby NP Centre 16.55. Change to M3 to Guisborough (buses wait for each other), change again at Guisborough, M1 to Redcar
