▲ M6 ROSEDALE BUS STOP

Until mid August, the bus stop in Rosedale Abbey can't be reached by Moorsbus M6 due to building work to replace Rosedale school's roof. Please catch the bus from the temporary bus stop by the village green opposite 'Graze on the Green' tea rooms. The driver will keep a look out for wayward passengers: passengers could also keep a look out for the bus!

▲ M5 & M31 POSSIBLE DELAYS IN AMPLEFORTH ON 21st AUGUST

There's a major cycling event in Ampleforth on Sunday 21st August, so our services may be delayed during the day. This could affect M5 and M31. We'll try hard to keep to time, but please bear with us (and the drivers) as they manoeuvre around parked vehicles in the village.

East Yorkshire's 128 Helmsley to Scarborough timetable is changing from September

It's all change again for the 128 in September. East Yorkshire's bus running from Helmsley to Scarborough via Kirkbymoorside and Pickering becomes two hourly, so our **Saturday** connections will not always work.

There are also changes to the Monday to Friday 128 services which also go two-hourly.

(Note that during the Moorsbus season the **Sunday** 128 services remain as in our timetable).

FREE ADMISSION at these historic sites

Gisborough Priory (yes, we've spelt it right!) is well worth a visit to see the ruins and the beautifully restored gardens. Gisborough Priory was founded in about 1119, supported by the de Brus family (ancestors of Robert Bruce, King of Scotland). The priory was developed on a grand scale and by the time of its dissolution in 1539, it was the fourth richest in Yorkshire.

▲Moorsbus M4 and M3

Byland Abbey was one of the largest and most ambitious creations of the Cistercian order in Britain. Built on reclaimed marshland from about 1150, it was designed to accommodate about 100 monks and 200 lay brothers. The magnificent west front with the remains of its rose window dominate the ruins. And there's the nearby Abbey Inn for refreshments.

Thanks to Geof's Moorsbus archive, here's a 1999 picture of the Leven Valley M7 bus waiting at Thirsk Station to start its journey to Helmsley. That year Moorsbus used a number of small buses for some of its services, including 12 seaters These were great for some routes such as between Helmsley and Osmotherley, or further into Dalby Forest, but as funding from the National Park and County Council stopped, the economics became very different. Today we use 33 to 44 seaters which provide the flexibility of coping with a large walking group, and if necessary passengers could stand: a minibus legally can't carry standing passengers.
