majority. We're really sorry if that is not you, and we'll still work to see what further improvements we can make.

This year's timetable has come about as a result of hours of work to ensure that we don't duplicate existing services by other operators, that the services are legal with regard to routes, drivers' hours and rest breaks, and to ensure connections which make it possible to get to and from many places in and around the North York Moors.

We review every service and (assuming we can raise the money) in 2024 we hope to operate a similar timetable to 2023, but over a longer season and with a few minor improvements to timing.

We're also mindful that many of you

have told us we need better marketing and we'd agree. But our resources are limited both in cash and people, plus, the area we cover stretches from County Durham to Humberside, from the coast to the A1.

One great help would be if more passengers were able to help promote Moorsbus to friends and through local shops, clubs, churches or pubs. We don't expect everyone can deliver timetables door-to-door, but if everyone helped a little bit, we'd get the message out over the Moorsbus area. Just let us know if you can help next year. *Thanks for being part of us*!



OUR £ CAMPAIGN FOR 2024

We're launching our bid to raise £50,000 by the end of this year so we can operate Moorsbus over a longer season in 2024.

As you'll know, at the moment we haven't had any financial help from North Yorkshire Council, the National Park Authority, or the Teesside authorities but we hope that will change as they see what an essential service we deliver.

In the meantime, to launch our bid *Action for Yorkshire Transport* have generously donated almost £1000.
